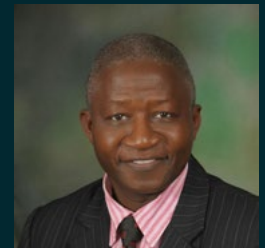

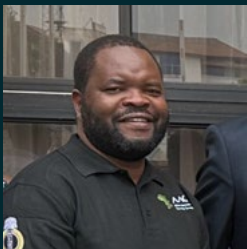

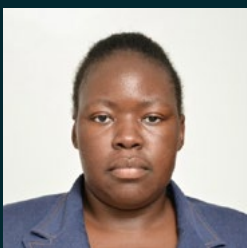

AAQS-TIQS EVENT IN DAR ES SALAAM; MODERNIZING QUANTITY SURVEYING PROFESSION IN RESPONSE OF THE GLOBAL CHANGES



Guest of Honor with AAQS Delegates

In a colorful and exciting concluded symposium which was held in the partnership of Africa Association of Quantity Surveyors (AAQS) and Tanzania Institute of Quantity Surveyors (TIQS), the participants from Tanzania side and across Africa made strong call for urgent action by industry stakeholders including AAQS members' associations and universities offering quantity surveying programmes to revisit the teaching curriculum of quantity surveying students and proposed to transform and regulate the practice from traditional roles to contemporary market driven services of the quantity surveying amid global changes.

Affirming up AAQS agenda of professional advocacy at African continent, such symposium was preceded by AAQS EXCO Meeting held on 21st March 2024 and followed with AAQS-TIQS symposium on 22nd March 2024 both events were held at Ramada Resort in Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania. This was the third time for AAQS having their event in Dar es Salaam, others being 2009 and 2016. In the EXCO meeting one of the deliberations is to encourage the Northern region to be active part of AAQS so that we push together

the Quantity Surveying agendas in the African Union and Africa Development Bank. Also, African QS fraternity leaders among other issues, stressed the importance of AAQS working closely with national association members, professional registration boards and higher learning institutions offering QS programmes across Africa to harmonize the academic qualification standard of the QS graduates be of minimal differences among Africa Countries. By so doing, it will take forward QS professionals by leverage on the employment opportunities across Africa and at global stage.

Given the challenges posed by the global changes in technology and other metrics, the QS fraternity African leaders went further to advocate the diversification of QS roles with a target to grab all opportunities by rapidly responding on the market needs and conduct themselves in ethical and good manners. "As the services of quantity surveyors are required in all sectors of economy including the building and infrastructure, insurance, mining, oil and gas as well as in the academic sector and other specialty areas like arbitration, claim management.... training on

the field of studies in the colleges and our offices should navigate in such diversification. Otherwise we may find ourselves out of touch and client need.....” QS. Bernard Ndakidemi, President of Tanzania Institute of Quantity Surveyors and Vice President, AAQS Eastern Region argued in his opening remarks.

The Dar Es Salaam event witnessed being officially opened and graced by the Chief Guest, Eng. Godfrey Kasekenya. the Deputy Minister for Works who represented Honorable Mr. Innocent Bashungwa, Minister for Works and Member of Parliament from Tanzania. Also the event brought together global partners of the quantity surveying profession with the presence of QS. Matthew Ngulube, President of the Africa Association of Quantity Surveyors (AAQS), QS. Segun Anjalenkoko, President of Commonwealth Association of Surveyors and Land Economist (CASLE), Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors (RICS) representative, Mr. Boniface Waweru and the company of other AAQS delegates from West,

South and Eastern Africa regions. Also government leaders were in attendance too, QS. Nyaswa Kalomo, Assistant Director from the Ministry of Works, Arch. Ludigija Bulamile Chairman of the Architects and Quantity Surveyors Registration Board (AQRB) and Arch Edwin Nkunduma; Registrar of the Architects and Quantity Surveyors Registration Board (AQRB).

In what it could have been termed as Dar Es Salaam Declaration, all invited leaders, AAQS delegates and host members from TIQS reached consensus during their deliberations on the symposium theme to embrace and strategize on how members’ national associations would innovate the adoption of the global changes and modernization of the QS profession. The delegates departed with message to disseminate across Africa to their colleagues to champion such new strategic direction of the quantity surveying modernization in the response of global changes.

TAKE AWAY: Here is a wrap of lessons learnt throughout the preparation of the event to make it remarkable and successful.

1. Target; direction is very key: to set up standards of your event, the kind of event you want to have
2. Plan; after knowing what you want and where you want to get you then plan on how to get there. The plan here involves breaking down of the requirements and activities, key personnel responsible for such activities and the budget as well AAQS President and TIQS Organizing Committee
3. Team work; have come to learn that team work is to understand that your role to play matters to contribute to the success and your colleague's role to play matters as much as you. Good cooperation and communication is very necessary to team working also valuing the input of others no matter how small it may look like. Team work does not mean to compete one another that one should seem to be performing better than the rest but helping one another and pushing one another to successful get there.
4. Trust; being trusted and to trust others as well that they can deliver however following up and checking now and then is very important.

Qs. Festus Mukunda Litiku**

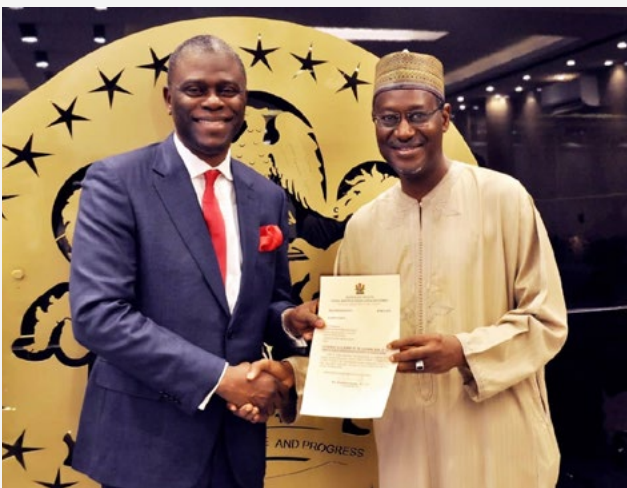

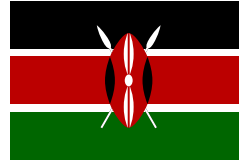
